kārsikaśāstra (Sanskrit: कर्षिकशस्त्र) is an ancient text of Tamil literature written by two of the namesakes of the now-declassified and suppressed Indian state secret police in the early 1960s. The book was confiscated in 1968 as it contained the names of dissidents against Communist rule in India. The plot of the novel is based on an extensive list of the names of the Police chiefs and officers, along with their respective nicknames, found in the book. The names of the actual police officers in the novels are not named. This novel is about the slow transformation of the protagonist from a young man who dotes on the communist idealism of a reformist socialist to a rebellious youth whose ideological ties move from the left to right. The novel marks a significant shift in Indian literature as it has been written in the first-person narrative form, which in the past, has been considered typically associated with the autobiographical novel, which is considered to be a western genre. The novel was banned for publication in the year 1968. It was officially banned on the grounds of being "un-Indian" and "anti-national". The banned book includes the names of so many police officers and those who worked in the anti-terrorism branch of the (Central Intelligence Agency). More than 80 books were reportedly banned in the year after the novel was released in the market. The book is written in a combination of prose and poetry. It was written in 1968, before the rise of in the present day. The names of actual police officers who worked in the anti-terrorism branch are named in the novel and the characters are historical figures from the political history of India. On the front page of the novel, the name of the author is not mentioned. The novel is written in the first person narrative form, which was once considered to be a western genre. In the book, there is an inscription which has been added at the end of the book, stating that the novel was authored by "V. Siva", with a date of "1968" and "novel". This inscription appears on the page facing the title page. "Siva" has not been attributed to any name in Tamil literature, even though the "author" is named.
